Pattern of the Question Paper

Question No. 1 Reference to Context from Sections A, B and C.

Candidates will be required to explain four (4) passages of reference to context out of Eight (8) of five marks of each, with a total of 20 marks.

Question No.2 will also be compulsory. Candidates will be required to attempt TEN (10) questions out of Fifteen (15), to be answered in about 5 lines each. Each question will be of 4 marks to a total of 40 marks.

The other 3 questions will be essay-type questions of 20 marks each one from each section with internal choice to a total of 60 marks.
